Jasmina Bojic is an International Relations Professor at Stanford University and founder of the United Nations Association Film Festival (UNAFF), an annual international documentary film festival held at Stanford University each October. She has also worked as a journalist for more than twenty-five years, covering many political and cultural events, including the Academy Awards and the Cannes Film Festival.

On the film: “Bhutto is the story of the first woman in history to lead a Muslim nation - Pakistan. Her two terms in power saw acts of courage and controversy as she eradicated polio and stood up for women, fought the male-dominated political elite and a nervous military leadership... With her assassination she transcended politics, but left a legacy of both simmering controversy and undeniable courage.”

Sophomore Anush Ammar will be joining us for the discussion and to provide insights on the historical, social, and political realities of her country.
