Jasmina Bojic is an International Relations Professor at Stanford University and founder of the United Nations Association Film Festival (UNAFF), an annual film festival held at Stanford. She has also worked as a journalist more than twenty-five years, covering many political and cultural events, including the Academy Awards, Cannes Film Festival, Venice Film Festival, Berlin Film Festival, San Francisco International Film Festival, Sundance Film Festival, Tribeca Film Festival, Golden Globe and Spirit Awards interviewing noted world politicians, scientists, directors, producers and actors. As a follow-up event to John Prendergast and George Clooney's work on Sudan, she will be showing "A Great Wonder," first screened during UNAFF 2004, a film

that details the effects of war on Sudanese children, their lives as refugees, and their struggle to rebuild their lives outside of their homeland. Sudanese student Shadi Bushra will also be joining the panel for discussion.
