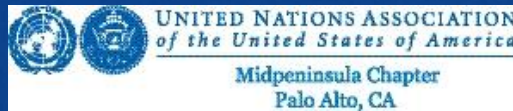

Based on the biography by Sir Brian Urquhart, the film reveals the little known role Bunche played in drafting the sections of the U. N. charter that led to the independence of a large part of the colonial world.
