## REGISTER TODAY

1. Open your camera on your smartphone.
2. Select the rear facing camera. Hold your device so that the QR code appears in the viewfinder in your camera. Your device recognizes the QR code and shows a notification.
3. Tap the notification to open the link associated with the QR code.
