THE 26th UNAFF (United Nations Association Film Festival) BEGINS THURSDAY, OCTOBER 19 THIS YEAR'S THEME IS "SOLUTIONS"

PALO ALTO MAYOR TO PRESENT ON OPENING NIGHT FOR ONE OF THE OLDEST DOCUMENTARY FILM FESTIVALS IN THE NATION, WHICH ALSO EDUCATES AND ENGAGES LOCAL COMMUNITY

October 17, 2023 - The <u>United Nations Association Film Festival</u> (UNAFF) will begin its 26th annual presentation on **Thursday, October 19, 2023** at **Mitchell Park Community Center**, 3700 Middlefield Road, Palo Alto, California. The festival includes 60 documentaries and six panel discussions around the theme, "Solutions." It takes place October 19-29 in Palo Alto, East Palo Alto, San Francisco, and Stanford University. Opening Night kicks off with a proclamation to the festival and welcome remarks from Palo Alto Mayor Lydia Kou.

It was a high grossing comedy starring Jane Fonda, Dolly Parton, Dabney Coleman, and Lily Tomlin. But now, workplace inequality is no longer a laughing matter. What does the evolution of women's rights in the workplace 40 years after the movie "9 to 5" look like?

Founder and Executive Director Jasmina Bojic states, "UNAFF looks to emphasize strategies and approaches that offer solutions to the world's current burning problems in this year's festival presentation." The festival theme, "Solutions," continues the enduring devotion that the United Nations Association Film Festival has for the principles of the <u>Universal Declaration of Human Rights</u>, currently celebrating its 75th anniversary.
